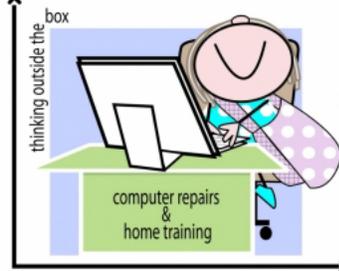


SHIRL'S COMPUTER SOLUTIONS

I've been thinking about what I should share with you this month, and a few things came to mind. I'm usually inspired by what I see when a computer arrives for repair or by a phone call with a question from someone.

The first thing I'd like to mention is in regards to your email. If you're getting more and more spam, you're not alone. One way to protect yourself and others is the way you send out emails. Whenever you're sending mail to more than one person, use the BCC option. "Blind Carbon Copy" prevents people from seeing all the names of the people you're sending the message to. Instead of a list of names, all they'll see is name of the person who sent it, (Your Name) or "undisclosed recipients". When you see all those names in the headers of your email, you can usually pull the addresses of other people from them. So can spammers! This is a courtesy and safeguard that should be used. Also, remove the headers, all that writing in the emails that you forward. It's a trail that continues with each forwarded email that you send!

Another way to deal with spam is to block it from coming into your computer. There are some free programs that you can get and you can "train" them to identify spam and put it into a specific folder.
