April 8, 2014 is the end of life date for Windows XP. ☹️

After April 8, 2014, Microsoft won't provide any security updates for XP. That means any security flaws that hackers find won't be fixed. Your computer will be a sitting duck.

(In Microsoft's defense, it extended XP's "end of life" date several times due to its popularity. It really should have ended years ago.)

Plus, once Microsoft stops supporting XP, other companies will follow suit. It takes a lot of time and money to make sure programs and hardware work on all the versions of Windows out there.

If you do use Windows XP after April 2014, it's basically at your own risk.

Having security software installed will help, but it will get more and more dangerous to use as time goes on.

I don't recommend using a Windows XP computer as your main computer after next April. You will want to start using a new operating system. If you plan to stick with Windows, that means upgrading to 7 or 8.

Windows 7 is the closest in look and feel to XP. In fact, it's shaping up to replace XP as the operating system that people will be using as long as they can.

That's why you need to take precautions. Here's an example of what could be going on with your FB account:

You've just discovered your Facebook account has been posting all kinds of weird, pornographic, or generally inappropriate content to your Wall and/or News Feed. Your friends are annoyed with all the questionable posts and requests coming from you.

So what's happening? It could be a virus or you've been hacked! So now what do you do? Here's a few tips to keep you safe.

Always log out of Facebook when you're signed in on someone else's machine, and if you can't login to Facebook any longer follow these instructions [Facebook Help Center](#). If you feel that you've been hacked, change your Password and remove unwanted Facebook Apps. Last but not least, run a security program like Malwarebytes to remove any infections. I recommend that you change your password often with FB. It's too easy for hackers to find out your passwords, so make sure that you use one that has symbols, numbers and letters. (and write it down so you don't forget what it is!)

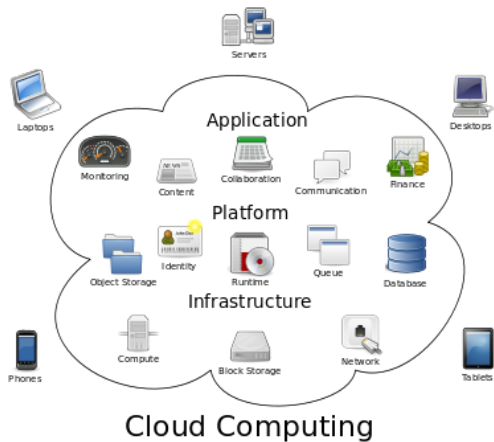

Cloud Computing



Cloud computing refers to applications and services offered over the Internet. These services are offered from data centers all over the world, which collectively are referred to as the "cloud." Examples of cloud computing include online backup services, social networking services, and personal data services such as Apple's MobileMe. Cloud computing also includes online applications, such as those offered through Microsoft Online Services.



One "Cloud" application that you can put on your computer is Dropbox. This is a great program that lets you share your files from computer to computer. Download and install it on iPad, tablets, desktop computers, iPhone and Androids and laptops. The link is here. I use it all the time and it's a time saver and easy to use.
