I always recommend <http://www.winkflash.com> for printing needs because they have great prices, but more importantly they do amazing work. That depends on the quantity and quality you're looking for. Remember that inkjet printing gets very expensive when you're doing large volume printing, AND the paper gets expensive too. Another option? Your local Wal-mart!

How many of you use shortcuts when you're working in Windows (Word, Excel etc)? I know that I use the Ctrl +A key all the time to select everything in a window, or the Ctrl+P key to send my information to the printer. Where do you find these? **The Hidden Master List of Windows 7 Shortcuts**

Here's how to find them:

1. Open the Start menu
2. In the right-side pane, click "Help and Support"
3. In the Help search bar, enter "shortcuts" (without quotes)

A list of items will be displayed. Click "keyboard shortcuts" and you are off to the races! Also check out the snipping tool which I'll mention next! ☺

Because we like to save things that we find on the Internet, here are a few tips to help you with that task....

- In your accessories folder you'll see the **snipping tool**.

This is a great tool for copying an article or image.

When you go to the snipping tool, right mouse click on it and select "pin it to your taskbar". That way it will always be available for you when you need it. It will show up on the bar across the bottom of your screen.

It's available in Windows Vista and Windows 7. The link below explains how to use it.

### **Adware**

Adware is free software that is supported by advertisements. Common adware programs are toolbars that sit on your desktop or work in conjunction with your Web browser. They include features like advanced searching of the Web or your hard drive and better organization of your bookmarks and shortcuts. Adware can also be more advanced programs such as games or utilities. They are free to use, but require you to watch advertisements as long as the programs are open. Since the ads often allow you to click to a Web site, adware typically requires an active Internet connection to run.

Most adware is safe to use, but some can serve as spyware, gathering information about you from your hard drive, the Web sites you visit, or your keystrokes. Spyware programs can then send the information over the Internet to another computer. So be careful what adware you install on your computer. Make sure it is from a reputable company and read the privacy agreement that comes with it.
