El Capitan......Where does Apple come up with these names for their operating systems? It's been released (September 30), and I'm looking forward to this one. Having used Windows machines for 20 years, I miss some of the features that aren't available on the Mac. This is why I never gave up my Windows machines! Whenever there is a new operating system released for the Mac, it's generally a good idea to upgrade. They improve features that will help the user to accomplish tasks easily (like the split screen that's been added), and improve security (in this version they've added a new security feature called "System Integrity Protection"). Who shouldn't upgrade? Anyone who has an older machine, if you haven't been upgrading all along when newer versions of the operating system have been released, or if you run software that won't be compatible with the newer version. It's also really important that you backup everything on your Mac before you do an upgrade like this. One hiccup and you've lost all your information! The thing to watch out for is when they ask you to install Adobe Flash Player to view it. If you're already viewing videos without any problems on Facebook, then you know something is wrong with the request. If you click on the link, what you'll really be installing is the virus that's attached to that link!

How to Remove Conduit Toolbar From Firefox

Click on the link above and "Download Now Free Full Version" in the middle of the page. Make sure that when you install it you watch the prompts. Hit decline on the first two and then take the checkmarks out of the boxes on the last screen. (or you'll probably install another toolbar you don't want!)

Note: You may encounter an error from your browser saying that the Toolbar Cleaner program could harm your computer. This is a false error, the program is perfectly safe.

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**DEADPIXEL** Question of the day! Do you know what a dead pixel is? Right now, at this very second, you're looking at pixels. Sure, you might think you're reading words on a screen, but those words are just thousands of pixels in the millions that make up your screen. Each pixel is a group of the colors red, green and blue that combine to make any color needed. Unfortunately, pixels are mortal. They can die or get stuck on a color, which can affect the brightness and clarity of your screen. How do you know if something is wrong with any of your pixels? They tend to look like tiny discolored dots on your screen. This free website will help to repair the pixel. http://www.jscreenfix.com/

I also have a tip for fixing a pixel that's worked for me. Take a pencil and use the eraser end to press on the pixel and very often it will release it and repair the spot.



**Fake Security Warning** 

A new form of pop-up security scams seems to be catching a lot of people off guard with their cleverly designed schemes. You'll essentially get a popup that appears to lock up your browser and warn you that you've been infected and that you need to call a toll free number so a certified security expert can help you. This scam is not limited to Windows users as a Mac specific version of the scam has been planted around the Internet as well. The scammers plant malicious links on social media, in clever phishing email messages, in user forums and in the comments section of popular websites. Here's the thing, none of the legitimate antivirus programs will post an 800 number as your first course of action, because they actually don't want you to call them. Good security software will block known attacks and malicious websites and will only detect infections during a scheduled or manual scan. They won't ever pop-up their 800 numbers so now you know it's a red flag.



### Ever lose your Windows Product Key? When

you bought your computer or your new copy of Windows, you may have assumed you'd never have to re-install the operating system. However, there are plenty of reasons why you might have to re-install Windows. Whether a particularly nasty virus has torn apart your registry, or years of digital muck has built up on your hard drive and is hurting your performance, a clean slate could be just what the doctor ordered!

But what if you don't have the Windows product key? It's easy to forget, but to prevent piracy, Windows and other software requires a unique product key for installation and re-installation.

Did you hang on to your packaging? Did you write it down somewhere? If not, don't fret! You don't need to purchase a brand new license.

**Enchanted Keyfinder** can track down your lost product key.

Just download the free program and extract it to your computer. Once you run it, Enchanted Keyfinder will search through your registry to find where the key is hidden! It also can find the product keys for **Microsoft Office.** 

No installation is required, and the keys are stored in common file formats that are easy to open and print. I would definitely run this now and keep a printed copy of your product keys in a safe place, just in case.

In Facebook, if you see a headline that says "Get Newly Introduced Facebook Dislike Button on Your Profile", don't click on it! This scam is either a survey scam or an attempt to steal a user's login credentials. If you fall for this scam, change your password immediately.

Have you updated your Apples devices **to iOS 9**? Is so, you probably have noticed something different. The keyboard now defaults to lower case and switches to caps only when you hit the shift key. If you want to go back to the old all caps Keyboard, just go to Settings, General, Accessibility and under the keyboard Option turn off Show lowercase keys.

And finally....what about Windows 10? I'm sure that many of you like it, but I don't hear from you! I hear from the people who are having all kinds of problems with the upgrade and find themselves wanting to go back to the older operating systems. Here's the latest on what I'm hearing:

#### **Activation issues**

First and foremost, some people are reporting difficulty activating Windows 10 once it's installed. The bad news is there's really nothing you can do on your end to fix it. The good news, however, is that this issue usually resolves itself after a few minutes.

## **Chrome is crazy**

Chrome browser users are running into a bunch of problems with bogging and slow-downs, especially with performing heavy tasks like streaming video.

We'll have to wait for Google to iron out the bugs but in the meantime, turning off all your extensions will help a bit. If that doesn't help, try reinstalling Chrome.

#### Where are my favorites?

The new Edge browser is so much better than Internet Explorer. To be fair, it would be difficult to make a browser worse than IE, but Edge is a nice simple browser that's quick and clean.

But where are your favorites?

Click the ... button to open the menu and then click Settings. Scroll to Import favorites from another browser, and then choose your old browser and click Import.

#### Folder fail

According to some users, there actually is one area where Windows 8 is better than Windows 10: The email app in Windows 10 doesn't allow people to create subfolders when organizing their email.

For most people, this is hardly an issue. Unfortunately for people who do have an issue with it, there's no fix for the time being.

### **Connectivity complaints**

A number of Windows 10 users are complaining that their Wi-Fi is cutting out and it won't reconnect. This is actually a pretty common problem across all versions of Windows, and the fix is the same as it is for Windows 8, Windows 7, and every other version out there: Reboot.

Some users have said that disabling Wi-Fi sharing helps make Wi-Fi connectivity a bit more stable.

To be fair, every operating system needs to be tweaked at first. Time will tell how user friendly this one will be.

A CAPTCHA (an acronym for "Completely Automated Public Turing test to tell Computers and Humans Apart") is a type of challenge-response test used in computing to determine whether or not the user is human.
